

First Aid Kit for Pets CHECKLIST

A first aid kit for your pets should include these additional items in a waterproof container:

- Nylon leash
- Towel or clean cloth
- Muzzle
- Compact emergency "blanket" (available in the camping department of many stores)
- Cotton-tipped swabs
- Instant cold pack
- Small flashlight with batteries (AA)
- Latex (or hypoallergenic material) gloves
- Vetrap™ and PetFlex® flexible, self-adherent bandages
- Gauze sponges & roll
- Material and adhesive tape to make a splint
- Safety pins (medium size 4)
- Sterile pads
- Small scissors
- Tweezers
- Magnifying glass

Other

- Hydrogen peroxide (3 percent)
- Rubbing alcohol
- Topical antibiotic ointment
- Antiseptic towelettes
